Anointing: The Sacrament of Anointing is available upon request. Please do not wait until it becomes an emergency because a priest may not always be immediately available.


Baptism: Parents must be active and registered Parishioners.

HEALINGS AND THE PRESENCE OF JESUS AT JESUS FEST '24 - Butternut, WI

Jesus Fest '24 took place Sunday September 8. The Catholic musical group "Elijah" from Illinois performed. Many people were touched by the sincerity of their testimony for the Lord, combined with an excellent music performance.

A priest officiated over the reading of The Litany of Healing & Repentance which was used at the 2024 National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis, IN. The Litany focuses on healing of the heart which often takes place before healing of the body.

After the Litany, a healing session was held in the style of the Encounter Ministries seminar held in Rhinelander last September of 2023, a Diocesan event. A lay person presided over this session.


A number of healings in Jesus' name were reported. Here are some:

- Two people with neck problems were healed
- One person with sciatica was healed
- One person with arthritis could now stand on leg with no pain in knee... her shoulder also increased its range of motion.
- One woman came to the Fest needing poles to support her painful legs she was healed and left the Fest carrying the poles under her arms!
- One man with a blood disease felt a tingling in his body (a sign that God is healing). He sensed he was healed and will get confirmation from his doctor.
- One woman who had some mental illness, woke up the next day feeling very happy.
- One man, as he was prayed for, said he felt heat in his painful feet (another sign of God healing), and with tears, said his feet were now much better.
- Two men with neuropathy in the feet were prayed for and also feel much better, and believe they will be totally healed (many healings are gradual).
- One elderly woman said she can now get up out of her chair with no assistance.
- One man suffering from depression, after prayer, felt so good he laughed with joy.

EXPERIENCES OF PEOPLE WHO WERE PRAYING FOR OTHERS:

One woman describes it like this:

"I had my eyes closed and prayed the healing prayer out loud as the prayer leader told us. The lady was wearing a hot pink top, had short grey hair, with a pink bandana around her neck. She was with her husband who also had his hands on her and also prayed. As I prayed, I had my eyes



closed and could feel under my fingers like a pop and then a crackle - kinda like when you feel cartilage cracking. The prayer ended and the lady turned her head to the right and said, 'I haven't been able to do this in years.' When the prayer leader asked if anyone had been healed 80% she raised both hands, but only chest high, so the leader didn't see her. I then said, 'do you need me to pray over you again?' and her husband was smiling and said, 'no, she's good.' Later my sister ran into her in the house and said, 'how's your neck doing' and she turned it way to the right, more than even right after the initial healing and again said, 'I haven't been able to do this in years.' So, that's my experience. Wish I'd thought to get her name and where she was from. Next year if we do this again, I'll be sure to get that info."

This same woman later had a vision of Jesus at Jesus Fest walking among the people. Here was her description:

"I was back by the picnic table and there was space in front of me, but behind everyone else. The leader was praying out loud and said something like Jesus is among us and I had a momentary vision of Him (Jesus) walking through that space in front of me, but behind everyone else. Long white robes, brown long hair, couldn't see His face. It was very fleeting... I had a sense of peace, calmness, and love."

A man who was praying for a woman describes this experience:

"I can only speak for my own experience but I was praying for a woman's shoulder and arm. I was looking at her with love and thanking God for her and praying for her healing when I felt a sudden presence from outside of me envelope me with a heightened sense of love, joy and peace. It lingered through my being for what seemed to be about 7 seconds. I was overwhelmed by it and have not felt it before. As it was passing I noticed my sister (next to me praying for another person) making sounds like she was experiencing what I was and so I looked at her and might have asked what was that? But filled with joy!"

The sister describes her experience:

"I've thought about it a lot. There was no wind or movement that I remember. It was more of a strong feeling that if it had movement would be considered like a wave or strong fast wind. And it came suddenly as we repeated the prayer of healing after the prayer leader. It was an emotion like awe and wonder. It made me want to laugh out loud. I could hear my brother next to me experiencing something too because of the emotion in his voice. Afterwards when we said something like "what was that?!" One of us said it was love and the other agreed. It all happened so fast. Other thoughts in my mind at the time was how Jesus was really there and how unworthy I was to be asking Him to heal this man's shoulder."

Praise God! The Presence of Jesus was felt by many people at Jesus Fest '24. Glory to God! Thank you, Jesus!

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE — Fr. John Muir @LPi

When I was a wet-behind-the-ears seminarian, I was sent for an immersion with the poor. For one month, I lived in a home for adults with developmental disabilities. It was a challenge for me because the residents had significant communication issues. A 30-year-old man there named Robin was totally deaf and mute. He had Down's Syndrome. He looked like a Viking, with a shock of red hair and a fine beard. But I felt awkward and disconnected from him. All my normal ways of interacting failed. I resigned myself to the fact that we'd never connect.



Then one morning something amazing happened. He was on the living room floor quietly playing with toys. Watching him from a chair, I sensed Jesus' words float into my mind, "Whoever welcomes one such child in my name welcomes me,

and whoever welcomes me welcomes not me but the one who sent me" (Mark 9:37). I thought, "Jesus, you must somehow be in Robin." I sheepishly made sure no one else was in the room, and then I spoke in a clear voice: "Jesus, are you there?" Robin did not turn to me and say, "Hi, John. Yes, it's me, Jesus." He kept playing with his toys in silence.

But something changed in me. From that moment on, it was easier to just be with Robin, to joke around with him, to try sign-language with him, to let him be himself, and for me to be myself. His "disabilities" were no longer obstacles to overcome. He became just Robin, my friend.

Who in your life seems awkwardly distant or uncomfortable to be with? Next time you see him or her, quietly invoke the name of Jesus, and see how the barriers disappear in you.
